
The first was the "Twerzels" evening for which we had a pretty packed house, thanks to Patchway Festival Committee for doing all the organising and ticketing for the evening.





YOUTH WORK UPDATE:

In April 2019, Patchway Town Council announced that it would continue to fund Southern Brooks Community Partnerships to deliver youth work sessions to support young people in Patchway. At the same time, Southern Brooks Community Partnerships secured 3-year funding from South Gloucestershire Council (2019 - 2022) to deliver additional youth work sessions in Patchway. We also have funding from the Community Fund until March 2021. Due to these funds, we are now delivering 6 youth work sessions per week across 5 days. We work with young people from years 5-12 through centre based and detached youth work. Each session is targeted at a specific age to ensure all young people feel welcome. Our sessions are planned through consultation with young people and often include cooking, sports, arts & crafts, support around mental health and other related subjects. Ternaya Cummings, Employment, Skills & Youth Development Manager says 'This is an exciting time for youth work in the area. We hope to be able to work with lots of young people over the next few years through our youth work delivery. We would really like input from young people and parents if they have any suggestions around what activities / courses / themed sessions they would like to see us deliver. We would like to thank Patchway Town Council for the continued support for youth work provision in the area'.

In September 2019, Patchway Youth Centre will be renamed 'The Patch' following consultation with young people and the public. HAPPY 20th ANNIVERSARY to FOUR TOWN AND VALE LINK COMMUNITY TRANSPORT



What a wonderful day was had by all who attended the Four Towns and Vale Link 20th Anniversary celebrations, on Friday 2nd August. Over 70 guests attended including members of the charity, local councillors, local community groups as well as Four

Towns employees both past and present, who all came along to help celebrate 20 years of the charity having been in operation. Four Towns started in 1999 in a small office in St peters Church, Filton. Volunteer car drivers used their own cars to help transport people to clubs, medical appointments and on shopping trips. They eventually got enough funding to be able to purchase their first ever minibus. Four Towns has flourished ever since now being based in Frampton Cotterell with 28 vehicles now in their current fleet and a work force of over 30 employees including many drivers, PA assistants, management, office staff, volunteers and trustees. Dennis Rogers chair of Four Towns and guest of honour Shirley Holloway opened the celebrations with a speech on their own time spent working within the organisation over the years. To summarise Vale Link came into being in late 1997 when Vale Link was nothing more than an idea that came into the minds of four people. They were successful with their bid and funding became available. This was distributed between Four Transport charities, with Vale Link Community Transport scheme being one of them. This enabled them to hire staff, they were fortunate then to be gifted, a bus by another Community Transport company. Their fleet began to grow from one bus to three. Soon after there were talks to merge. They then eventually amalgamated with Four Towns who were based in Patchway to become Four Towns and Vale Link Community Transport. Shirley then went on to become Chair of the charity for 7 years from 2005-2012 and been a great support to the charity ever since. There was also a chance for guests to learn more on the history of Four Towns with a display featuring many key moments and interesting facts captured throughout the years, as well as learning more about the many great people who have contributed their work within the organisation over time and became part of the history that has helped create what Four Towns is today. Four Towns and Vale Link Community Transport said a very special thank you to Win Williams (the very first ever Coordinator of Four Towns) who attended the event. Jerk Style Chicken Skewers Recipe



Prep time: 20 mins Cooking time: 10 mins Serves: 4

Ingredients

- · 1 clove garlic, crushed
 - · Juice of ½ lemon
 - · 1tbsp olive oil
- · 1-2 tsp jerk seasoning, to taste
- · 2 skinless, boneless chicken breasts, cut into 12 large chunks
 - · 1 red pepper, cut into 16 chunks
- · 1 onion, guartered and separated to give 16 pieces·

To serve: 4 sweetcorn cobettes

Method

1. Soak 4 wooden skewers in water for about 30 minutes.

- 2. Mix the garlic, lemon juice and olive oil with 1 tsp jerk seasoning (or 2 tsp if you prefer a spicier flavour). Stir in the chicken and set aside while you prepare the vegetables.
- 3. Thread a piece of pepper onto a skewer, then onion, then chicken, finishing with onion.
- 4. Try other vegetables like mushrooms and courgettes or even fruit like mango or pineapple.
- 5. Cook on the barbecue for 8-10 minutes, turning frequently. Alternatively, cook under a preheated grill.
- 6. Meanwhile cook the sweetcorn cobettes in boiling water, or on the barbecue for 6-8 minutes.

Add flatbreads or boiled rice for an easy meal. Recipe from NHS website Change 4 Life.
